SHEN has now been funded by Communities Scotland and Scottish Enterprise for 18 months. In that time we've become a significant voice in the development of policy and practice in the field of homelessness and employability in Scotland. We've held a range of seminars exploring employability issues; carried out research on homelessness and employability in Scotland; and made a significant contribution to the development of the Employability Framework for the Scottish Executive.

We're now holding our first national conference highlighting the policy and practice issues in homelessness and employability. Our main aim is to find ways of linking the development of homelessness strategies with the issues raised in the Employability Framework. We'll be looking at the ways in which the homelessness strategies of local authorities can link to employability programmes; how service providers can work in partnership with employers to provide positive work experiences; how housing providers and the education sector can effectively support employability strategies. Speakers will come from a range of backgrounds, and our workshops will encourage participants to contribute to the development of good practice through examples from their own experience.

This conference will be of interest to the wide range of stakeholders working to find sustainable routes out of homelessness: local authority and voluntary sector homelessness services; employment, education, careers and training providers; policy officers responsible for developing strategic responses to homelessness and unemployment at national and local level; and employers who operate an inclusive employment policy.
